FEWER STUDENTS OF DIVINITY

A LONG with the evidence of pres ing need for co-operation among the Christian churches comes the announcement, in a report to the Presbyterian General Assembly, that the number of divinity students attending Presbyterian colleges is less than it was forty years ago. In 1881 the number was 28 for every 10,000 Presbyterian families. In 1921 it was only seven.
