After partaking of a lunch in the woods they strayed off and unwittingly lost themselves. After walking a couple of bours on a road they reached they enquired how far they were from Elora and found that it was some fourteen miles, in an opposite direction from that which they were pursuing.—Mr. Edward Coney working in Mr. Isaac Modeland's foundry had a narrow escape from death on the 10th instant. He was grinding steel pins for reapers, on an emery wheel, which makes two thousand revolutions per minute, when the wheel split into four pieces. The Thistic Pest.

The return of the summer means to the Canadisar farmer the recommencement of a fight with that annually recouring pest, the thistile. The following may be of service of those who have to do the fighting:—

The Berlin correspondent of Land and Water publishes a piece of information that will be welcome to many a farmer. "Who ever knew," says he, "of one plant so inimical to another as to kill it by a mere tough? This, however, seems to be the case when rape grows near the thistle. If a field is infested by thistiles, give it a turn of rape seed, and this plant will altogather stative, suffocate, and chill the thistile out of existence. A trial was made with different varieties of rape seed in square plots, where it was found the whole ground was full of thistiles, and nobedy believed that rape was having a fair run. But it had, and as it grew the thisties vanished, faded, turned grey, and fried up as soon asthe rape leaves began to touch it. Other trials were them made in flower pots and garden beds, and the thisties always had to give in, and was altogether annihilisted, whether old and fully developed or young and tender."

THE MACDONNELL CASE DISPOSED
