Situation In Russia.

St. Petersburg, Nov. 15.—The proletariat of St. Petersburg has summoned another general, political strike, beginning at noon today this action was decided upon last night by the workmen's strike committee, which is now completely under the domination of the Social Revolutionists, whose leaders openly proclaim that their ultimate object is the complete overthrow of the monarchy and the establishment of a democratic republic. This is also the real aim of their brothers, the Social Democrats of Poland, but the proclamation issued keeps this in the background and apparently supports the popular sympathy for Polish autonomy and the indignation against the application of the death sentence being imposed on the Cronstadt mutineers. No newspapers were issued this afternoon. The telegraphers are expected to join the strikers. Advice from Vladivostok late this afternoon indicate that the mutiny of the soldiers and sailors has been quelled and order partially restored, the commandant having agreed to send home the reservists and time expired men detained there.

London, Nov. 15.—The St. Petersburg correspondent of the Daily Telegraph sends an interesting picture of Count Witte, attending a cabinet council for many hours on Monday until long after midnight, his physician meanwhile waiting in an adjoining room to see him. Then being afflicted with a severe headache and unable to sleep the premier devoted the whole night to arrears of official work.

My opinion, says the correspondent, is that unless the conditions change, Count Witte's staying powers will be subjected to a very dangerous strain.

THE FARMER'S REALM.

Practical Suggestions For The Improvement of The Farm.

Cleanliness and through ventilation of the stables, grooming of the cows and cleaning their udders before beginning to milk is certainly as important as cleaning of milk pails and cans. A writer in Mass Ploughman tells us.

Occasionally there is a writer who dares to tell the farmer that he needs to pay more attention to the cleanliness of his stables and a more thorough ventilation, to the grooming of his cows and the cleaning of their udders before he begins to milk and to such other points as may insure clean milk. And this certainly is important as the cleaning of milk pails and pans used to be years ago.

Too many stables are in a filthy

condition, not fit for milk to stand in for a minute after it is drawn, and really with an air so foul that it cannot help but taint the milk even in the act of milking. Disguise it as we may under the name of microbes, it is really nothing but filth. They are not properly cleaned out, never swept or washed. There is not enough bedding used or any other absorbent to hold the odors from the excrement, neither is there a chance for the air to circulate freely enough to carry them away. In the matter of pure air the old-fashioned barns were to be preferred in summer at least though often in winter there was rather more air than was pleasant for man or beast, when the temperature outside was below zero.

I. C. R. SURPLUS IN SEPTEMBER

Ottawa, Ont., Nov. 16.—With a decrease in the working expenses and an increase in the earnings the Intercolonial Railway shows a marked improvement for the first quarter of the present fiscal year. The investigation which the men and the deputy made into the working of the road in the summer months is having its effect. This is shown in a small surplus of earnings over expenditure for the month of September. The earnings for the months were \$686,271 leaving a surplus of \$24,659 for the three months. The average deficit has been reduced to \$25,939, so that on this estimate the year would close with a small deficit. The figures for the three months are as follows:—

The deficit for July was \$30,962 and for August \$71,512, the surplus for September was \$24,659. The intention of the department is to use gasoline engines on the branch lines in P. E. I. There are certain other economies in view which will keep the expenditure little short of the earnings if not within them.

There will be a saving of \$300,000 for the year in maintenance of way and \$100,000 in coal.

Little Boys Give Lives to Save Girl

YOUNGSTERS AGED FIVE AND SIX HEROICALLY RESCUING CHILD FROM IN FRONT OF TRAIN.

New York, Nov. 14. Kingston Blauvelt, aged six, and Abraham Diamond, aged five, of Jamaica, L. I., lost their lives today in saving the life of a little girl who was in danger of being run down by a railway train at a grade crossing. To save her the Blauvelt and the Diamond boys rushed forward and shoved her across the track and to safety, but there was not time for them to cross or retreat, and they fell beneath the wheels. They were taken to a hospital where both died a few hours later.
