LICENSE COMMISSIONERS.

NEW C.P.R. TELEGRAPHIC WIRE.

This telegraphic wire is for use between Edmonton and Winnipeg alone and no intervening points will be allowed cut in. The wire connects the two cities and other eastern points than ever before.

NEW PEACE RIVER ROUTE.

Between fifty and sixty Peace River settlers met Friday night in the Grand View Hotel, their rooms over the McDougall block, to discuss the route for the number present and adjournment was made to the hotel, where the short route to Grande Prairie was discussed. Several maps were placed before the meeting of the various proposed routes, which Messrs. Kimp and Heathcote, surveyors, have prepared a large map of what they claim to be the shortest route possible into the Peace River country. Mr. Kimp was present and explained the new route, which is by the Grand Trunk Pacific railway as far as Medicine Lodge, some thirty miles west of Wolf Creek, then directly north thirty-five miles to the Athabasca river, across the Athabasca, thence seventy-five miles on the Simonette River which leads to the present trail at a point ten miles west of Sturgeon Lake. This is forty two miles from Grande Prairie, making a total distance of the G.T.P. line at Medicine Lodge of one hundred and thirty miles. Messrs. Kimp and Heathcote who are desirous of putting in a saw mill at that point as far as the Athabasca River, a distance of thirty-five miles and also place upon the river a ferry at their own expense, if the government will supply the cable and wire for the new route, and have left the matter in the hands of the committee to fully investigate and bring in a report at the next meeting the date of which will be announced later.
