Notice to Taxpayer!

Business Profit Tax Act, 1917.

Attention is directed to the following sections of the Act:

Section 8 (a) Every person liable to taxation under this Act shall, on or before the first day of February in each year, without any notice or demand, deliver in duplicate to the Minister a return in Form B. of the Schedule of this Act, or in such other form as the Minister may prescribe, covering each accounting period for which he is liable to taxation. In such return the taxpayer shall state an address in Newfoundland to which all notices and other documents to

Act may be mailed or sent. Section 9 Provides for returns to be made by any "person" suspected of being liable to taxation.

Section 10 Penalty for not making returns. Section 10 (b) Penalty for false statement in returns.

Statement of auditor, including balance sheet and profit and loss account should be forwarded with returns.
