### British Cow.

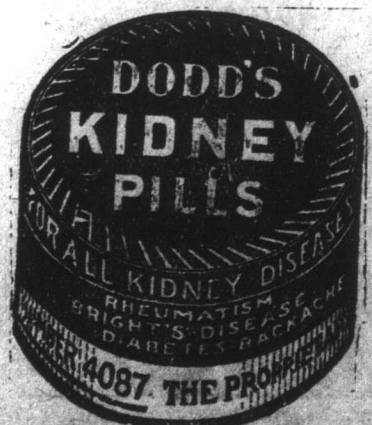
GIVES 3,000 GALLONS OF MILK.

There are said to be 50 "2000 gallon" cows in this country, of which 55 are British Friesians.

### Keel of Schooner Columbia Laid Down.

VESSEL IS BEING BUILT AS A POSSIBLE CONTENDER FOR INTERNATIONAL TROPHY.

ESSEX, Mass., Dec. 13.—The keel of the fishing schooner Columbia, to be operated by Captain Ben Pine, of Gloucester, owner of the ill-fated Puritan, which was lost on Sable Island this year, and associated with the ship laid at the shipyards of A. D. Story. The Columbia was designed by Burgess and Paine, of Boston, as a possible contender for the International trophy.

The owners have stated that the vessel's lines, designed before the announcement by the Canadian trustees of the trophy of the displacement rule giving vessels more freeboard than is customary in the New England fishing industry would not be altered, race of no race.

The Columbia is to be 105 feet at the waterline and will have a much lower side than the Bluenose. This is to provide ease in transferring fish from dory to deck while trawling.

The schooner, which is to be built along the general lines of the Puritan, lost on Sable Island, is expected to be commissioned early next April.

### Miracle Healer of New Zealand.

TO ENTER POLITICS.

WELLINGTON, N.Z.—Wiremu Ratana, the Maori miracle man of New Zealand, is reported to be about to enter politics. Ratana came under world notice about two years ago as a worker of miracles, in healing. Unlike the usual healer, however, he shunned publicity and continued to work on his farm, teaching his people industry and temperance. He denounced the ancient Maori wizardry, and ascribed his powers solely to faith in the Divine Power. Ratana is now believed to be backing the movement of four of his followers to contest the Maori seats at the general election in December. He is being criticised for the alleged use of his spiritual powers in the material field of politics.

### Sailing Ship Industry.

#### SHOWS IMPROVEMENT.

LONDON.—The annual report of the British Empire Ship Owners' Association, which has 916 ships of 113,046 net tons on its books, says that the depression of the shipping industry for the past year has been worse than at any period since the war. Despite the fact that freights are still unremunerative, however, conditions in the sailing ship industry are improving. At the recent annual meeting of the Association the chairman said the index number of shipping freights was 46 in January, 1921; 33 in December, 1921, and in September, 1922, it was as low as 27. Although there had been a smaller decrease in the number of sailing ships since pre-war times, as compared with the previous decade, the result was due principally to the increase in the United States, which at present owned 41 per cent. of the world's sailing tonnage.
