



TAKEN FROM SEWER PIPE. ST, PAUL, Nov. 23.—Six weeks pa-ent search with a "mechanical blood ound" has resulted in the finding in sewer pipe of a tiny tube contain sewer pipe of a tiny time containing, 8800,000 worth of radium which disappeared from a hospital here.

Prof. Henry A. Erickson, head of the Physics Department, University of Minnesota, constructed ionisation chambers detectors which were atthed to electricscopes and begun to nt all along sewers leading from

To-day the detectors led him to a nine inch pipe in a sewer tunnel. The adium tube was found within two in-thes of a mark he made in the pipe.
