Following is the petition of the American citizens in Atna to President McKinley in respect to the Atna law:

Honorable Sir,--We, whose names are hereunto attached, all Americans, fully three-fourths native born, many Californians, all of whom have profound respect for the rights of our country...

We, your suffering brothers, husbands, fathers and children, stand erect like men, calling aloud to our countrymen for help and relief, calling for the rights of our servants and our countrymen, calling to our brothers, fathers and mothers...

The exact number of Americans holding these agreements we have no means of knowing, but we believe them to be not less than 10,000, and possibly 20,000.
