London, July 5.—In the House of Commons today, Arnold Postar, the secretary of the Admiralty, announced that the year's shipbuilding programme includes three battleships of a new improved class, six cruisers of the Monmouth class, and ten improved torpedo boat destroyers.

THE ROBBERS HAUL. Forty Thousand Dollars in Incomplete Bank Notes. Washington, July 6.—Treasury officials today stated that their information was to the effect that the men who robbed the Great Northern train at Warner, Mont., last Monday, secured \$40,000 in incomplete National Bank notes, which were shipped on June 28 from the National Bank of Montana at Helena.

TOWN BURNED. Versailles, Ohio Almost Destroyed by Fire. Greenville, Ohio, July 6.—The town of Versailles was almost entirely destroyed by fire, which started in the grain elevator of J. S. Seiber & Company, this afternoon.
