ELEVENTH YEAR. ROLLY NOT GUILTY TWO

IN ESCAPES OF THE FIRST CHARGES OF FORGERY.

The Jury Out About an Hour of time and on the Second Two H. Only One Charge of Embezzlement Remains to be Heard—Will Bank Go Any Further?

The trial of William Rowan Moffatt, a justice MacMahon and a jury five two of five indictments resulted in a verdict of not guilty in each case.
