**BY-LAW NO. 2, 1907,  
OF TOWNSHIP OF WARWICK.**

A By-law to provide for drainage work in the Township of Warwick in the County of Lambton, and for borrowing on the credit of the Municipality the sum of \$614.40 for completing the same. Provisionally adopted the 11th day of February, 1907.

Whereas, Robert Wilson, one of the parties interested and assessed for the construction of the Leach Local Drain, has petitioned the Council of the said Township of Warwick to have the said Leach Drain repaired.  
And, whereas thereupon the said Council has procured an examination to be made by C. A. Jones being a person competent for such purpose, of the said drain and the means suggested for said repair of said drain and of other lands and roads liable to assessment under the Municipal Drainage Act, and has also procured plans, specifications and estimates of the drainage work to be made by the said C. A. Jones, and an assessment to be made by him of the lands and roads to be benefited by such repair of the said Leach Drain and of other lands and roads liable for contribution thereto, stating as nearly as he can the proportion of benefit, outlet liability and injurious liability, which in his opinion will be derived or incurred in consequence of such drainage work by every road and lot, or portion of lot, the said assessment to be made being the assessment hereinafter by this by-law enacted to be assessed and levied upon the road and lots or parts of lots hereinafter in that behalf, specially set forth and described and the report of the said C. A. Jones in respect thereof, and of the said drainage work being as follows:

Petrolia, October 29th, 1906.  
To the Municipal Council, Township of Warwick.  
Gentlemen:—In compliance with instructions received from your Honorable Body I have made an examination of the Leach Drain lots 5 to 11 inclusive, and section 5, S.E. 1/4, of your Township and would recommend its being repaired as it is considerably dilapidated since its last repair.  
I would also recommend improving the lower portion across the easterly 1/2 of lot 5 and extending it a short distance into the drain on the northerly side of the Grand Trunk Railway right of way. The improvement referred to across the easterly 1/2 of lot 5 would consist of deepening it considerably across this lot more than in the last improved outlet on the G. T. R. R. will now permit of this.  
The culverts on the 6.7 sideroad and 9.10 sideroad are very much out of repair and need replacing with new ones the cost of which I have included in my estimate of the cost of the proposed work.  
I have sketched and detailed the drain out in stations of 2 chains or 8 rods each commencing with station 0 at the head of the proposed work, which is at the line between the west 1/2 of lot 11 and station 196 at its outlet into the drain on the G. T. R. R. property making a total length of 784 rods. Each stake is to be in the distance 1/2 in chains from stake 0 at its head.  
I have also prepared plan, profile specification of work, estimate of cost and schedule of assessment on the lands and roads affected, all of which I herewith submit.  
Following is my estimate of cost of the proposed work:  
Excavating at 0 to 40, 100 rods at 50c per rod \$ 20 00  
" 40 to 122, 368 rods at 5c " 184 00  
" 122 to 162, 120 rods at 5c " 60 00  
" 162 to 196, 132 rods at 5c " 66 00  
Building new culvert on 9.10 sideroad..... 30 00  
Publishing by-law and registering same, and Township Clerk's fees..... 56 00  
Survey, plans, estimates and reports..... 37 50  
Letting and inspecting work..... 70 00  
Assistance on survey..... 4 50  
Total estimated cost of work..... \$614.40

**SPECIFICATION OF WORK.**  
The drain is to be dug to the depths and dimension shown and figured on the accompanying profile with a slope of 1 horizontal to 1 vertical and bottom an even grade between stations.  
Where a fence is constructed along one side of the drain, the earth is all to be cast to the side opposite the fence and where no fence exists along the side of the drain, the earth is to be cast about equally on each side.  
The culverts on the 6.7 sideroad and 9.10 sideroad are to be replaced with new ones of 4 per centum per annum, a special rate on the dollar sufficient to produce the required yearly amount thereof shall over and above all other rates be levied and collected, (in the same manner and at the same time as other taxes are collected) upon and from the whole rateable property in the said Township of Warwick in each year for 5 years after the final passing of this By-law during which the said debentures have to run.  
5th. This By-law shall be published once in every week for four consecutive weeks in the GUIDE-ADVOCATE newspaper, published in the village of Watford, and shall come into force upon and after the final passing thereof, and may be cited as the Leach Local Drain By-law.
