

ELECTION CARDS

To the Electors of the Village of Watford—
I wish to contradict some rumors which have been broadcast.
1. I have never advocated putting red brick or any other kind of brick on Main street between the pavement and the sidewalk.
2. I have no desire to make the keeping of cows in town illegal.
3. I have no intention of forcing ratepayers to put in water mains or take water into their houses.
4. The ploughing of part of the Federal Square for a tennis court for the children and young people of the Village had the unanimous support of the directors of the Horticultural Society.
5. I own property in the Village and pay fairly heavy taxes.

The greatest need at the present time is efficiency, and efficiency with a reduction of cost.
Efficiency does not mean greater cost and higher taxes. Our pavement is an example of this. On Sept. 22nd last \$12,500 was received by the Village of Watford from the Department of Highways to be applied to the cost of our pavement. On Dec. 12th there was deposited in the treasury of this village \$2253.19, the first annual grant from the County Council to be used to pay our first debenture on our pavement. Hence, you can readily see that the pavement has not raised the taxes of the village.
The method adopted by the Reeve and Council and every official in the village should be such as to build up the village and at the same time lower the taxes. This is not a paradox. New public institutions such as a postoffice, new private residences, together with a large population will help build up the town even as the pavement does and at the same time lower our taxes.
Economic Efficiency is my motto with emphasis on the economy, for at this time of great stringency it is imperative that the burden of taxes be made as light as possible.
I want to thank the electors of Watford for their support in the past and to say that if I am elected to the Reeve ship I will do my best to represent the Village of Watford in the County Council and elsewhere.
