**T**He right Honourable, Henry Lord Cary, Viscount of Falkland,  
Lord Deputy General of the Kingdome of Ireland, hath undertaken  
to plant a Colony of his Maiesties subiects in the New-found-  
land: and his Lordship hath sent thither from Ireland this yeere 1623.  
many men and women under his conduct of Sir Francis Tanfill Knight,  
with all necessariess fit for them to build houses, cleanse land for Gardens,  
Madow, and Tillage, and likewise to prouide a place fiting for fishing, and  
such necessaries as appertaine therunto, for a greater number of people,  
(Gadwilling) to be sent thither the next yeere, and his Honour is well plea-  
sed to ente. reame such as shall be willing to be Adventurers with him there-  
in, upon very large and fit condicions, whi h are set forth in print, by his  
Lordships order, and are to be had at the Gilded Cocke, in Paternoster-  
row; and in his Honour's absence, he hath authorized his agte, Master  
Leonard Wellsted, Gentleman, by warrant under his hand and Seal, to  
ratifie whatsoeuer shall be by him concluded with any in this Kingdome  
therin; The said Master Wellsts House, is at the lower end of Sain  
Martins lane in the field.

The Right Honourable Sir George Calvert Knight, principall Secre-  
tary unto the Kings most excellens Maiesty, hath also undertaken to plant  
a large Circuit of that Countrey: who hath already sent thither a great  
number of men and women, with all necessarie provisions fit for them; where  
they live pleasantly, building of houses, cleansing of land for Corne, and  
meddowes, Cabage, Carrats, Turneps, and such like: and they are prop-  
rietary to make Salt, for the preseruing of fissh, and for divers other seruices.  
And his Honour is likewise well pleased to enterteine such as will adven-  
ture with him therein, upon very large and fit condicions, as are to be seene.

The Wor. John Slany of London Merchant, who is one of the adven-  
turers of the New-found-land Plantation, & is Treasurer unto the Pa-  
tentees of that Society, who have maintained a Colony of his Maiesties sub-  
iects there, above twelve yeeres, & they are willing to enterteine such as will  
furher helpe the said Plantation, upon fit condicions.
