When thou mahest thy prayer to the 41maghy; when chou comest into his presence, thou must not only cherish all affection for thy friends and brethren, all good will to the great famly of man, but in the spirit of repaying blessings for curses, benevolence for hatred, kindress for the injuries of the most bitter foes When thou breathest hindness to all the sons of men, when thou feelest the glow of ardent affection for all the beloved of God, and canst pour out thy supplications for all inen with all the intensity of godly sincerity, then the Lord will make thy peace to flow like a river, and thy joy like the brightness of the norning-then wilt thou feel thyself refreshed as the parched ficlu when the clouds gently pour their treasures into its. bosom. "Thou shalt go forth with joy, and be led forth with peace: the mountains and the hills shall breah farth before thee into singing, and all the trees of the field shall clap their hands."
