Johns Hopkins Hospital Reports, Vol. VII., Nos. 1 and 2. Report in Gynecology. Johns Hopkins Press, Baltimore. 1898.

The excellence of the reports published by the above hospital press is so well established that one need say little of the Report in Gynacology for 1898, except that it is up to the usual standard. It contains two excellent articles; one upon the question of intraperitoneal drainage, judged from a review of 1,700 cases of abdominal section, written by J. G. Clark, M.D., and a second devoted to the consideration of the "Etiology and Structure of True Vaginal Cysts," by J. E. Stokes, M.D. Both articles are well worth reading and will be of service to the practitioner and scientist.
