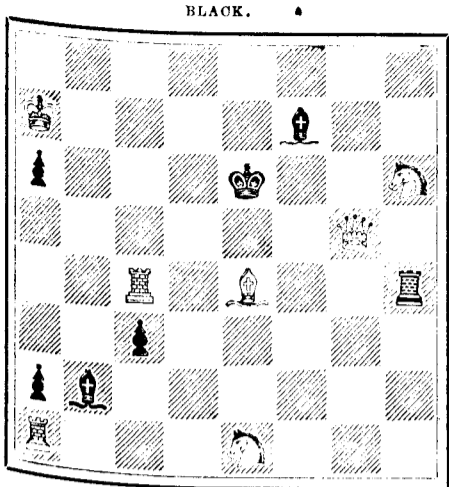


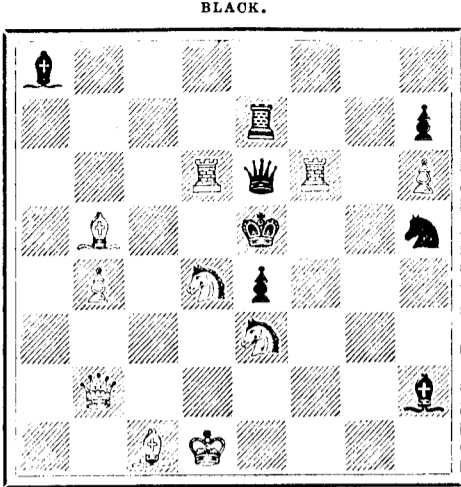

Note in Problem No. 576 there should be a Black Rook or Black Q Kt 7 instead of a Pawn.

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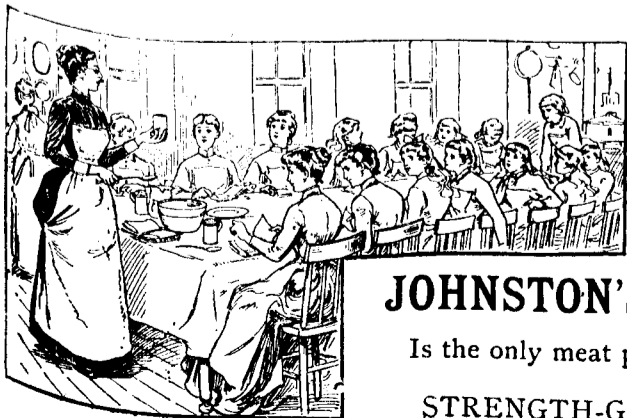


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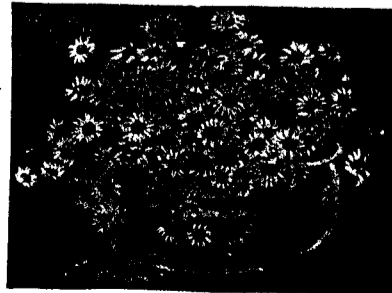


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
