ARTICLE 1

For the purpose of the present convention, the following definitions are agreed upon:--

(1) Slavery is the status or condition of a person over whom any or all the powers attaching to the right of ownership are exercised.

(2) The slave trade includes all acts involved in the capture, acquisition or disposal of a person with intent to reduce him to slavery; all involved in the acquisition of a slave with a view to selling or exchange ing him; all acts of disposal by sale or exchange of a slave acquire with a view to being sold or exchanged, and, in general, every act trade or transport in slaves.

ARTICLE 2

The high contracting parties undertake, each in respect of the territorial placed under its sovereignty, jurisdiction, protection, suzerainty or tutelage, far as they have not already taken the necessary steps:-

(a) To prevent and suppress the slave trade.

(b) To bring about, progressively and as soon as possible, the complete abolition of slavory in all its f abolition of slavery in all its forms.

ARTICLE 3

The high contracting parties undertake to adopt all appropriate measures a view to preventing and supervised to adopt all appropriate measures. with a view to preventing and suppressing the embarkation, disembarkation and transport of slaves in their territorials and transport of slaves in their territorial waters and upon all vessels flying

their respective flags.

The high contracting parties shall give to one another every assistance with object of securing the abolition of slavery and the the object of securing the abolition of slavery and the slave trade.

ARTICLE 5

The high contracting parties recognize that recourse to compulsory ed labour may have grave consequent forced labour may have grave consequences and undertake, each in respect the territories placed under its savening the territories placed under its sovereignty, jurisdiction, protection, or forced labour from developments. or tutelage, to take all necessary measures to prevent compulsory or forced labour from developing into conditions analogous to the compulsory of the computation of the computation
