NATIONAL OFFICE OF EPIDEMIOLOGY

The General Assembly of the International Federation of Animal Protection Societies, meeting at Geneva, Switzerland, on March 27, 1921, has decided to establish the International Office of Epidemiology. The members of the General Assembly, which includes the following countries: Argentina, Australia, Austria, Belgium, Brazil, Canada, Chile, China, Czechoslovakia, Denmark, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Italy, Japan, Mexico, Poland, Portugal, Russia, Sweden, Switzerland, Turkey, United States, Uruguay, Venezuela, and Yugoslavia, have agreed to contribute to the work of the International Office of Epidemiology, and to establish a central office in Paris, France.

ARTICLE I

The High Commission for the Protection of Animals has been invited by the International Office of Epidemiology to act as its secretariat. The International Office of Epidemiology is located in Paris, France.

ARTICLE 3

The sum necessary to cover the expenses of the International Office of Epidemiology will be determined by the General Assembly from time to time, according to the needs of the work of the Office. The amount will be determined by the General Assembly after consultation with the Director of the Office, who will be responsible for the administration of the funds.

ARTICLE 4

The High Commission for the Protection of Animals has been invited to act as the secretariat of the International Office of Epidemiology. The International Office of Epidemiology will be responsible for the administration of the funds.

ARTICLE 5

The General Assembly of the International Federation of Animal Protection Societies has decided to establish the International Office of Epidemiology in Paris, France, in accordance with the provisions of Article 2, paragraph 1, of the present arrangement.
