The Secretary of State for External Affairs presents his compliments to the Ambassador of the United States of America, and has the honour to refer to the Ambassador's Note No. 86 of October 9, 1951, requesting confirmation of the Canadian Government's approval of the following understandings which the United States Department had been informed were reached by representatives of the Royal Canadian Air Force and the United States Air Force at a meeting held May 31 in Ottawa to discuss the re-supply of the Joint Canadian-United States Arctic Weather Stations.
