Fifteen Petitions were laid on the Table.

Mr. Speaker laid before the House, Report of the proceedings of the Commissioners of Internal Economy of the House of Commons for 1929, pursuant to Standing Order 80.

Mr. Mackenzie King (Prince Albert), a Member of the King's Privy Council, laid before the House, by command of His Excellency the Governor General,—Report of the Secretary of State for External Affairs for the year ended December 31, 1929.

And also,—Copy of the Report of the Conference on the operation of Dominion Legislation and Merchant Shipping Legislation, held in London, England, in 1929.

Mr. Lapointe, a Member of the King's Privy Council, laid before the House, by command of His Excellency the Governor General,—Report of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police for the year ended September 30, 1929.

And also,—Report of the Superintendent of Penitentiaries for the fiscal year ended March 31, 1929.
