#### Mr. W. T. WHITE:

Arrangements were effected under which up to 31st March next His Majesty's Government lends to the Government of the Dominion of Canada the sum of £12,000,000. Of this sum £5,000,000 was advanced by the Bank of England for the Imperial Government up to the 24th December. To date the sum of £8,000,000 has in this manner been borrowed.

### Mr. W. T. WHITE:

Issues of Dominion notes were made by the Minister of Finance under the authority of Orders in Council as follows:—

(a) \$10,000,000 in order that certain obligations of Canada might be met as they matured. These issues were made at various dates after November 2, 1914.

(b) \$10,000,000 advanced to the Canadian Northern Railway Company upon the security of \$12,500,000 of that company's four per cent debenture stock guaranteed by the Dominion under the provisions of The Canadian Northern Railway Guarantee Act, 1914. These sums were placed to the credit of the Minister of Finance and paid out under the provisions of the deed of trust securing the issue of said debenture stock. This advance is repayable, May 1, 1915, with interest at five per cent per annum.
