The weather for the past two days; in fact, for a week back, has not been conducive to the best interests of an already dull beef trade, which showed its reflex on the cattle market yesterday.

There was little or no snap in the trade. Talk about a good outside demand—there has not been such a thing scarcely all winter. Three or four buyers from Buffalo, here since Monday looking for a few snaps, and we venture to say they have not bought ten carloads all week; and then the country and trade are told that there was a good outside demand. People who talk this way have forgotten the days of export to Britain, when as many as two and three thousand cattle would be bought on this market in a forenoon, and that is only three or four years ago.

Why, the trade, we are sorry to say, is slow and draggy, considering the light uns of cattle.

And if two or three thousand cattle should be thrown on the market in any one day we fear the worst would be still to come in the shape of much lower values.
