but, it was in vain to set up opposition, experience only could manifest the truth; and he is blind indeed who has not occular demonstration of it now. It has been hinted to me that I should offer as a Candidate at next general election, for a seat in parliament, and I take opportunity to say that I would not sit in such, save but to move for a Convention in order to drawing up a new Constitution, urgently called for.

Having seen eigh'y summers and being at present in poor health, I am fit for no

great exertion; but, I am here in my own house ready to advise; and first, I may be conversed with by Inhabitants of Dereham: then, of the adjoining municipalities of Norwich, Ingersoll, and Woodstock. Their friendly manifestations for me last session of parliament was gratifying; and, should they heartily enter into my views of a Convention, that may be in session by next Christmas.
