"That they also take into confideration the regulation of the police of the Province, and cause commissions to be prepared for constituting an inferior criminal jurisdiction in the respective districts of Quebec and Montreal.

"That the Lieutenant Governor may cause any other member or members of the Council to be summoned to assist at the Board, whenever he shall think it necessary to consider of

" any matters regarding the tranquillity and good

1)

" order of the Province."

" Having thus at large recited the minutes to which the motion refers, the whole of Mr. Livius's conduct in Council is before your Maes jesty, and submitted to your royal wisdom; but your Majesty having been pleased to require our opinion in the case, it is our duty to " fay, that although it were much to be wished, " that the last of the above recited motions had 66 been propounded in terms more studiously guarded, and to appearance not so offensive to " the Governor; yet upon a full review of these proceedings, without any discussion of the au-" thority affumed by the Governor in the mode of removal, there does not appear to us good and fufficient cause for displacing Mr. Livius; " especially when we consider, what has been before observed; that no complaint or imputation " whatever
