A scarf in any shade of crepe de chene for the neck is very effective and easily made. Let it be two yards long and five inches wide; finish it all round with a tiny hem, and let the hems at the ends be an inch wide and machine stitched. Edge this all about with cream honiton braid run on neatly by hand with very fine thread. The middle of the scarf for about twelve inches is formed into about four tiny pleats or tucks reducing the width to about half. A double line of the honiton braid holds the remaining two tucks in place, as the edging forms a finish for top and bottom of this neck band. It takes in all about five yards of the honiton braid.
