

He did not announce that policy to the house.

Mr. Whitney: My hon. friend's statement is quite true with the two exceptions that I did not have a confidential interview with a temperance deputation, and I did not discuss my policy on this question.

Mr. Ross: He has no policy.

Mr. Whitney: That policy has been endorsed by a majority of 7000 of the people of this province.

Mr. Ross: That 7000 majority is a standing joke.

It is his hand played.

The reply was known at the parliament buildings before the house adjourned at 11 o'clock. Various expressions of opinion were given, some of the members going so far as to say that the premier's letter did not make a refusal, and it was freely stated that a spectacular move was coming before the end of the session.

"You may be sure," said one, "that the premier is going to do something heroic that will send his name ringing down the corridors of time. I believe, and I will be exceedingly well pleased if I am wrong, that the premier is yet going to do something pretty handsome for his temperance friends. I can't see that he can do anything, and he has still a brilliant opportunity to retrieve his lost fortunes."

Similar opinions were heard on many sides and the beautiful indefiniteness of the letter is going to cause considerable uneasiness.

A Disappointment.

F. S. Spence and G. E. Martier, who acquainted with the substance of the communication, listened with interest, but did not care to make any comment until they had time to fully consider its import. Mr. Spence, however, said that it would be a great disappointment if it was that intimation that nothing would be attempted this session toward meeting the requests of the temperance workers.

Incidentally, Mr. Martier was asked as to the rumor in an evening paper that an appointment in the Ontario license department might be offered him. He gave it a thoro denial. "I want nothing from the government," he said in conclusion.

Ed. Dickie, secretary of the licensed victuallers, was asked by The World and the letter read to him, but he would not express any opinion as to its meaning.

Deputation's Visit.

The visit of the deputation, which called for the letter from the premier, was made on Monday afternoon, the deputation being composed of about 20 clergymen and laymen prominent in the Methodist and Baptist Churches. Mr. Ross was told in pretty plain language that if he did not resign his prohibition, he could expect no more support from his prohibition allies. In reply he promised to make an answer within 48 hours that would "clear the atmosphere." The announcement was received within three hours of the time promised, but it is the atmosphere clear? Here is what he told the deputation on Monday:

"The question has come to a point where great precision is necessary, and I will give answer in writing, so that there may be no misunderstanding. My sympathy is with you. That goes without saying. But the question calls for judicious management in view of all the issues involved. I hope to give an answer which will clear the atmosphere to some extent. My intention is to understand where we are. Within 48 hours I think I will be able to give my answer in writing."



STATE DEPARTMENT URGES FOR GOVERNMENT RAILWAY

Liberals Voted Down Dr. Pyne's Resolution Favoring Experiment for Ten Years.

When the government bill to extend the Temiskaming Railway was considered by the committee of the whole in the legislature last night, Dr. Pyne offered a few observations in support of the government control of the railway. Dr. Pyne said a great opportunity was being presented to test the principle of public ownership and control. If it was known that the government would run the railway, the bonds of the railway would be going begging. What could be better than to say to the farmers and settlers in New Ontario that the government would run the railway, the construction regarding passenger and freight rates.

The operation of the public ownership principle in New Zealand was referred to. Under the progressive ideas that prevailed in that country, the railway was run at the lowest rates. He quoted an instance of a rate of four miles for a cent being given on the railway. He was sure that Mr. Russell and Mr. Pettipiece would go with him in amending the bill so that the government would run the railway and control, and Mr. Pettipiece was quoted as saying that the government could not handle the railway or fast enough to suit him.

Dr. Pyne moved "THAT THE TEMISKAMING RAILWAY BE RUN BY THE GOVERNMENT FOR TEN YEARS BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE TEMISKAMING RAILWAY AND ALL THE PROVISIONS REFERRING TO THE OWNERSHIP OF THE RAILWAY ARE HEREBY REPEALED."

Not to Be Held.

In reply, the premier said the question of government ownership was not involved, and there was no question as to the road to be leased to anybody. That had not been suggested by anybody. As a matter of fact, the government could not lease the road unless the lease was ratified by parliament, so that there was no question of the road being leased to anybody. The premier attached a good deal of importance to the principle of government ownership, but the principle had been adopted by the government in many respects. The government retained the right to purchase the railway and to run it as a public utility. As to government control, it had not been established that the railway was owned by the government, and he did not know that the railway was owned by anybody. Was Dr. Pyne sure that the operation of the railway would be a success? The international road was being run at a loss. New Zealand was not able to say that government ownership was a complete success there. If the government gave the railway to the Temiskaming Railway, the loss would have to come out of the pocket of the government, and the C. P. R. or any other railway would give a great many cheap acquisitions if the government would make up the deficit.

The government had no intention of leasing the road to anybody. The house would still be useful by adopting the policy of government ownership. The government would run the road to a private corporation after ten years, when it would become a public utility.

Great Opportunity.

Mr. Whitney pointed out that there was no proposition to give the railway over to private individuals after ten years. Dr. Pyne's proposition was that the road should go on and run it. When they spoke of government ownership, they meant government ownership and operation. Here was an opportunity to test the principle of government ownership. It was wise to put into operation the principle of government ownership and to see if it was successful. There would be a good reason to continue to operate the railway. If he understood the bill, he would be opposed to the principle of government ownership.

The premier observed that the government ownership and operation was not necessarily a source of revenue.

Mr. Beatty commented on a clause in the bill, which declared that the road was run from some source of revenue. There was no terminal point named in the bill. Mr. Powell thought it would be a good business proposition to run the road. He regretted that the cost of the railway had greatly exceeded the estimate. Another objection Mr. Powell found was the extremely large bonded indebtedness of \$30,000,000 a mile, fixed in the bill.

Kidd's Pertinent Query.

Hon. Mr. Davis got as far as the remark that the bill was the most important bill before the house when Kidd of Carleton interjected the query, "When about the temperance bill?"

"My hon. friend shows his anxiety to carry out in a practical way the cause of temperance," was the minister's reply.

"I carry out what I promise," said Mr. Kidd.

"The temperance bill is sub-judice," put in Mr. Fox.

Mr. Davis said it would be time enough to declare that the bill was with the road after full information had been obtained.

Mr. Beatty spoke in favor of throwing open the railway reserve lands for settlement, and Mr. Hendrie opposed the bill on the ground that the railway was not in possession of full information. They ought to have some definite information as to the value of the \$30,000,000 that was expended.

The premier said the information asked for by Mr. Hendrie would be given before the third reading of the bill on Monday or Tuesday next.

The amendment of Dr. Pyne was declared lost.
