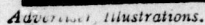

The reception accorded the Americans was a different matter. They were welcomed in Luxemburg and parts of Belgium and France. There they were given a friendly reception by the majority of the population. The attitude of the population of Rhenish Prussia was different. There they were met with antagonism was reported, but it was evident that even the children had been indoctrinated.
