his sudden departure, but they firmly believe that the call did not come upon him unawares, or find him unprepared. The Directors deeply sympathise with his mourning widow and family, and earnestly trust that while they sorrow, though not as those who have no hope, they may experience abundantly the consolations of the word and of the spirit of God."

We have also to notice the removal of one of the Vice-Presidents, the late Chief Justice McLean, one of the oldest friends of the Society, who died since our last anniversary, full of years, and of the honors, which he enjoyed as a good man and an upright judge.
