Captain Huston left last night for Detroit to join a regiment of engineers with which he will go to the front in the near future. He gained much ex-


a match for Magirl with Ted (Kid) Lewis at the Armory A. A., Boston, on Tuesday, the 19th.

McDonald arrives in the city tomorrow. The Glace Bay Gazette, in speaking of his bout with Rivers, says: "Roddie showed that he has improved wonderfully. He is as fast as a tiger on his feet, and used excellent judgment in timing his punches. He blocked well, and never appeared in a local ring looking in as good condition."

Since his last appearance in Halifax, Roddie has met a number of well known boxers. His first appearance abroad was as a substitute boxer against George Ashe, and the latter was only saved from a knock out by the bell. Ashe has to his credit four no-decision bouts with Battling Levinsky, and similar results with Jack Dillon, Billy Miske and others.

Roddie boxed with Jimmy O'Hagan of Albany, in a ten-round bout at Brooklyn, N.Y., which went the limit. The decision was given against him in the ten-round bout with Johnny Wilson at Providence in which he fought a game uphill fight. At Boston, New Year's Day, he knocked out Big Jim McDonald of Dorchester in nine rounds, and at the Staten Island A. A., a few nights after, Zulu Kid, and outpointed Gunboat Smith. He was outpointed by Angie Ratner in a 10-round bout at the Broadway Sporting Club in a great fight throughout, and which was first erroneously reported as the Nova Scotia boy knocked out. Roddie has since defeated Marty Cross. Roddie has also boxed a 10-round, no-decision bout with Joe Borrell at Rochester, N.Y., and was given the newspaper decision, and he also had a six-round bout with no decision with Tommy Coleman at Philadelphia. His last bout abroad was at Rochester, N.Y., when he won from Willie Langford, the U. S. colored middleweight champion, in 10 rounds.


