Price Changes Mixed at the Opening—Brisk Session in Montreal.



In North Carolina, says the statement, the peat beds are generally shallow and have an admixture of sands which greatly reduce their heating value. In other cases they are filled with logs which render the process of recovery almost prohibitive.
