I refer especially to the settlement


of the Austrian question. Under the treaties Austria was left with a popu

lation of about 6,500,000. Vienna, the capital, has a population of over 2,capital, has a population of over 2, coo,000; and with Greater Vienna it means that half the population of the country is in the capital. Of course this is a very unsound state of affairs, especially when Vienna is no longer the centre of distribution and the centre especially when Vienna is no longer the centre of distribution and the centre of activity of all the territory which formerly constituted the Dual Monarchy. In addition to that there are over 250,000 civil employees in Vienna. I think some here know how hard it is to decrease the Civil Service in any country. These are the reasons why Austria became almost—not only almost, but absolutely bankrupt, and the only apparent solution was its annexation to, or its absorption by, some of the neighboring countries. Its statesmen came to Geneva during the last assembly and pleaded for the existence and life of their country. A committee was formed which went to the root of the question and a solution was found. A loan has been granted to Austria; Great Britain, France, Italy and Czecho-Slovakia each subscribing one-fifth, and the remaining fifth being subscribed by other nations. One of the conditions was that there would be at Vienna a commission under the centrol of the League to decrease the Civil Service. It shows one of the activities of the League of Nations not connected with war, but nevertheless saving a nation from utter destruction. When it was announced to the Council that the solution had been found, M. Viviani, the French delegates, referred to the League as being the last resort for nations whose problems have become insoluble.


