PLEBISCITE ON DAYLIGHT TIME FEB. 28

This Recommended at Meeting of Commissioners Today

Period About Same as Last Year—Further Work at Newman Brook Recommended—Failure of Engine Caused Ferry Accident.

The city council, in committee meeting this morning decided to hold a plebiscite on the question of daylight saving time on Monday, February 28, the period covered to be about the same as last year—May 22 to September 11—although these dates were not definitely decided upon.

Are you in favor of Daylight Saving Time? Yes. No.

The mayor's report was recommended to council. Commissioner Jones asked for permission to get a set of Venturi meters for the Spruce Lake pipe line.

The ferry accident. Commissioner Bullock presented a report of the ferry superintendent regarding an accident to the ferry last night. He said that Engineer McHeath reported that part of the engine failed to answer the reverse lever.

Newman Brook Work. Regarding the proposal to take out the bridge over Newman Brook on Adelaide road, the city engineer presented a report in which he said that if this work was carried out it would be advisable further to deepen the brook at an estimated cost of \$8,000.

New School Suggested. Speaking about the drainage of this area, Dr. Frink said that this section was the reasonable place for the expansion of the city.

Mr. Jones said he would bring in a resolution on the matter on Monday. Dr. Frink suggested that the city should carry on the work with its own staff, relieving the contractor, now at work there, of part of the contract.

Commissioner Thornton said he did not see why the whole matter was not brought up when the first proposal to deepen the brook was made.
