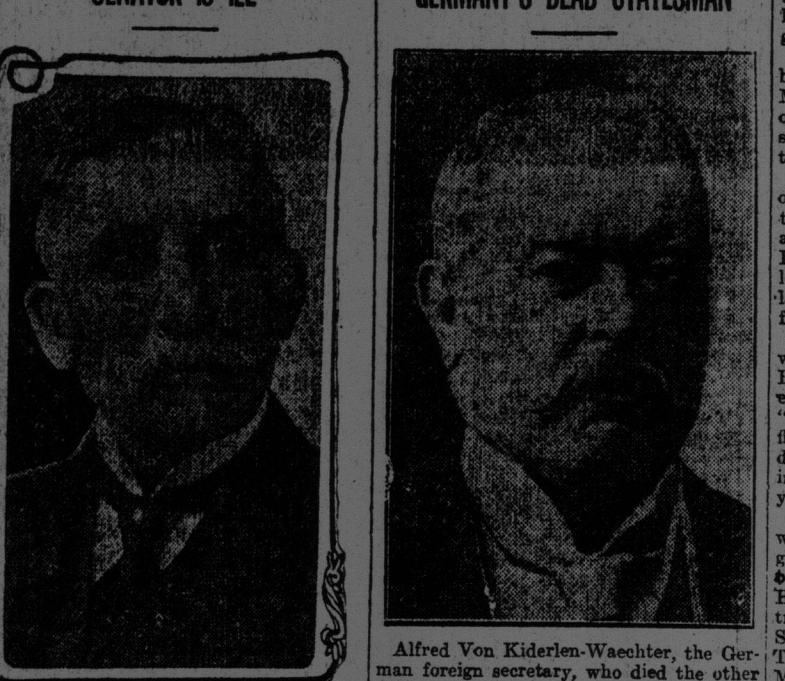

GLASGOW LEADS IN SHIPBUILDING

Glasgow, Jan. 3.—All shipbuilding records have been eclipsed by the achievements of the Clyde firms during the last twelve months. Calculations, based on the year's launching, show a total tonnage of 650,000 in round figures, beating the total for 1911 by some 20,000 tons.

The 1912 total exceeds the entire tonnage of Germany in 1911, and is more than twice that of the United States. It is also equivalent to more than half the output of all England.

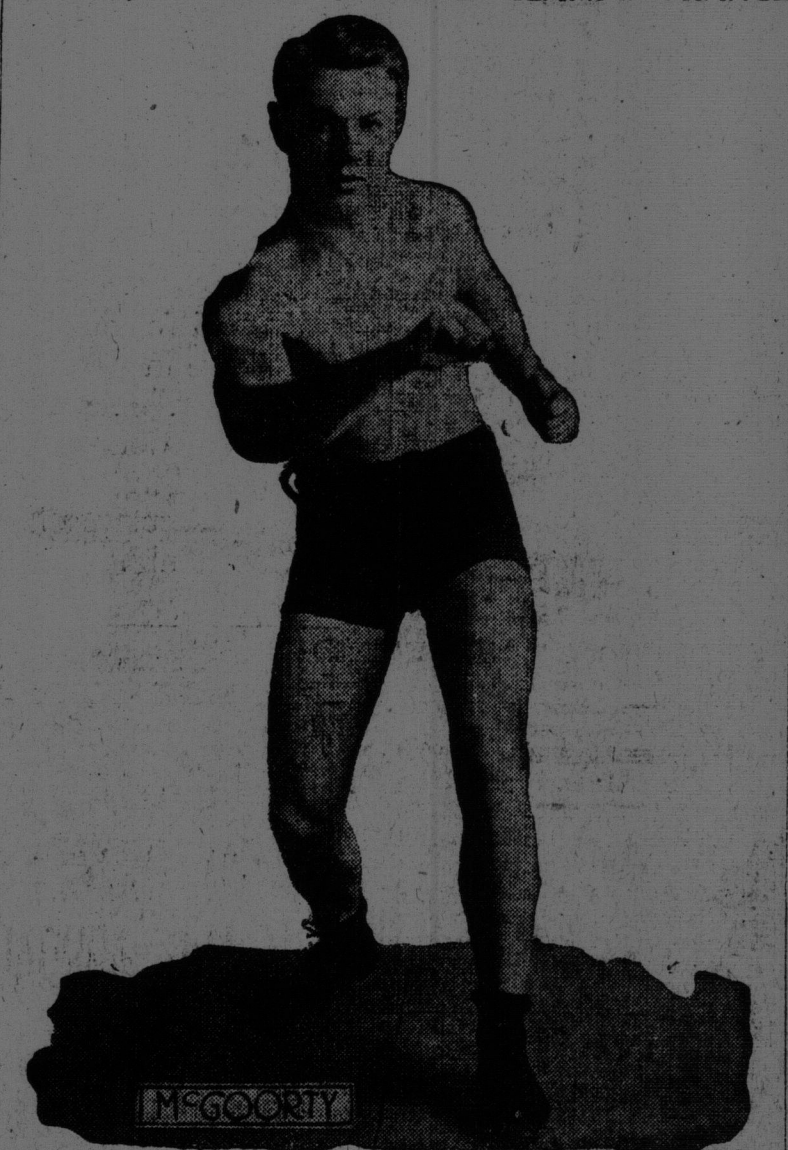

HOMESTEADER'S NICE SIDE LINE

Silver Fox Worth \$1,000, Seven Beams and Many Raccoon Skins

Edmonton, Alta., Jan. 3.—W. H. Robertson, a homesteader in the Athabasca district, north of here, has arrived in Edmonton with the pelt of a silver fox, valued at \$1,000; two brown foxes, seven beaver hides and 218 raccoon skins. Silver-tipped foxes are rare, and when properly marked the pelts are worth small fortunes. Three silver foxes have been trapped in the Lac la Biche country this season, the Record-Herald.

Robertson reports big game and all fur-bearing animals are numerous in the north country, saying also that the homesteaders will also bring in many skins this winter. The chief drawback so far is the unseasonable high temperature.
