MAX ROSS DIES SUDDENLY IN HIS APARTMENT

Had Been a Resident of St. John for Thirty-Five Years

WAS PROMINENT IN
FRATERNAL CIRCLES

Wife and Daughter Survive
—Has Many Friends Who
Will Regret Death.

Death came suddenly to Max Ross, wholesale dry goods and manufacturers' agent, in his apartment, Park Hotel, King Square at 5.40 o'clock yesterday afternoon.

Mr. Ross had been ill for the last few weeks and while confined to his apartment was able to be about. He was feeling quite improved yesterday and had been conversing with friends during the afternoon.

As late as 5.30 o'clock he finished a telephone conversation with Mrs. Ethel Marais, of 10 Wentworth street, saying that he expected to be able to go to his office on Monday. Mr. Ross then seated himself at a table and had just commenced eating his evening meal when he fell off his chair. The maid summoned Albert Seeley, brother of the hotel proprietor, who in turn called Eli Boyaner, Michael Baig and Hyman L. Marcup, who immediately arrived on the scene. Dr. S. H. McDonald was called and on examination said that Mr. Ross had died instantly from heart trouble.

His Family.
Mr. Ross leaves besides his wife, one daughter, Mrs. H. Berman, of Sackville. Max Ross was one of the most prominent residents of this city, having lived here for more than 35 years and his wide circle of friends will learn with deep regret of his sudden death.

He was a former member of the Royal Kennebec Yacht Club, a member of St. John Lodge, F. and A. M., also a past chancellor in the Knights of Pythias order. He was a life long member of the Synagogue and until recently was most active in organization work.
