WHEREAS it is provided by the 58th Nection of the Act 31 Victoria, Chapter 6, initialed:
"An Ac, respecting the Customa," then the ignporter of any capille of swine may slaughter and cure and pack the same in bord, under such Regulations and restrictions as the Governor is Council may from time to time make for this purloss.

And whereas it has been found expedient to give effect to the said Section 53, in so far as regards the imp ritation of swine, and to all feet the terms of the Regulation as for this purpose, adopted by Order in Council of 22nd of May, 1868; in this Excellency, on the recommendation of the donorable the Minister of Customs and underthe provisions of the said Act has been pleased to opeder, and it is hereby ordered; that the said Order in Council of the 22nd day of May, 1868, and the fregulations thereby established be and the same re hereby repealed, and that the following Regulations be and are hereby adopted and established in lieu there of that is to say.

I Upon the importation of swine for the purpose of slaughter, the Importer shall enter the same for Warehouse, upon the usual form of such entries, stating upon its face, the sumber and value of the hered and sea the stations.

and soid, otherwise shall remain in full virtue.

2. Upon the reception into the Bondin house, the swine shall be regarded only and it shall not be lawful to remove any from such Warwhouse alive; nor shall of the produce of such swine be remove from, for any purpose, without a permit-Collector, or proper Officer of Customs, case of all other bonded goods.
