No. 9-24 is made with either 4 or 5 holes. Patented 1893. Improved 1894.

Below we summarize many of its excellencies and new features :

The upper grate is constructed to unlock and drop forward, where it is held in horizontal position, making it a very convenient toast rack. The lower or draft grate is arranged with an outside handle, to enable the operator to easily shake all ashes from the draft, without the annoyance of either dust or waste of time, which is a great advantage over old methods of poking out the ashes. The feed door is cut to the top, to admit large wood. The hearth slide can be drawn out when more than ordinary draft is needed. The fire bottom is constructed in three sections, making it less liable to warp and cheaper to repair. The oven top is raised in the centre, adding strength to the plate, and concentration of heat in operation. The oven is thoroughly ventilated with hot air, which secures purity and evenness in baking. We are quite sure all housekeepers will appreciate the reversible shelf, one of the greatest conveniences possible to a cooking stove. The oven door is tin-lined and fitted with a foot-opener, nickel outside shelf and tea-pot stand; also back shelf, towel bars and high shelf when so ordered. Edges polished, silver and tile ornamentation. Ask for no other stove.
