The bones were examined by the coroner, who found unmistakable signs of the aboriginal burial custom in the shape of trinkets and the bark from trees which is always placed over the corpse of an Indian before burial.

VICTORIA WEST TO RAISE \$5,000

Victoria West Athletic Club wants to extend the club house and provide a billiard table and social quarters, put in baths and showers, and, great event of all, provide shells for the waters of the Gorge and put on the water pair and four-oar crews to compete in the rowing against the James Bay Athletic Club, the Vancouver and Seattle crews, and with this object in view the club is going to raise \$5,000. To get the matter started the club had a general meeting at the rooms last night and had almost every member there and also many of the residents of Victoria West, who turned out to see what the young club had done for the boys of Victoria West in the last few years. A committee took the matter of raising the \$5,000 up a week ago, and last night D. S. Tait presented the views of the committee to the members and friends who were there—the work done by the club for the boys of the district, its position in athletic circles of the city. The club had done exceptionally well with the poor families they had for the members. It was to enlarge the buildings and the scope of the athletic programme that the money was wanted. He wanted to see the green and white colors on the water here and across the Sound, and thought the matter could be carried through. T. D. Sedger had prepared plans of the extensions of the club house, including hot and cold water baths, showers, lockers, dressing rooms, amusement and reading rooms, in the plans they had also provided for a building on the waterfront to house the boats that will be purchased when the funds are raised. A motion was carried that the enlargement be carried out as soon as the funds were raised. Messrs. Leonard Tait, Sedger, Monteith, Thomson, Brewster, Oliver and others all spoke supporting the plan, and the following committee selected to go ahead with the matter: D. S. Tait, L. H. Osell, E. Hooper, A. E. Hooper, R. Hand, J. Campbell, F. Wilson, R. Lewy, A. C. Sedger and A. Kirk. This committee will meet again Monday night and start work arranging details of a campaign.
