"Bacteria, capable of producing bad flavors, are found nearly everywhere; in the fine dust of the stable, on the hairs of the cow, which frequently drop in the milk, in the crevices and corners of milk palls, strainers and separators, which have not been properly washed and scalded; and also in the foul air of the dairy house, cellar, or well, where the cream is kept. To keep these germs out of the milk it is necessary to keep the stable clean, to brush the cow's udder before you begin to milk, to see that all milk utensils are thoroughly washed with warm water and then scalded, for unless the water is boiling the germs will not be killed. Then, whenever possible, put these milk things in the sun, as sunlight is one of the greatest destroyers of undesirable There are 2,200 cows in the province of British.
