





TORONTO, Jan. 1.—Today's muni-cipal election in Toronto have resulted in the return of Mayor Coatsworth and the triumph of the power by-law. Mayor Coatsworth polled approximate-ly 13,000 votes. Lindala, his Socialist rival, polled about 8,000, with Noble far behind. Returns for the by-law are not yet complete, but so far indicate that it has been carried by a vote of 9,53 to 2,443, a very large vote on a money by-law in this city. All three other by-laws were defeated. They were for the authorization of lands to provide a new street car entrance to the ex-hibition grounds, to build a trunk sever and to build a bridge across the railroad tracks on Yonge street. H. C. Hocken, Dr. Harrison and Controllers W. P. Hubbard and J. J. Ward of last year's board were elected to the Board of Control.








