

The two express Cunarders are just now busy record-breaking. They have gained the British Government subsidy, and have done speed in excess of that required to gain this. For many years now express steamers have beaten the best sailing-ship speed record, but this was by no means always so, and it is perhaps interesting to recall some of the notable performances under sail.

The ocean-going sailing-ship, which has for some four hundred and fifty years been a great—perhaps the great est—factor in the civilization of the world, has been thrust aside by the steamer. The spreading white wings are becoming rarer year by year. The race of British sailors is almost extinct. But there are still sailingships as fine as any that ever floated; yet it shows how little is known of the sailor's art in these days, when even shipping papers consider a recent passage of the King Ceorge worthy of remark.

She came from Hong Kong to New York and arrived first. In a period of twenty years this happend elighty-six times. The record for the navy, on Admiral Duke's authority, is that of the Zebra sloop, which in 1867 sailed from Monte Volke's mail of the World, has been throught nothing for a vessel of her size. The little Thermopylae, a third of her tonnage, once sailed from Foo Chow to the Briglish Channel in ninety-one days. And in sailing-ships, as in yachts: "time-allowances" for tonnage must be considered when comparing results. But as far as British ships go, it may almost be said that there has been no oversee a racing worth the name for nearly forty ears. In the heroic days from 1840 to 1865 there was as much emulation and "carrying on" between the leading sailing-ships as there is now only in yacht racing. Ships are now built to carry well, are usually under-sparred as compared with clippers of old days, and are undermanned.
