SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST MINING REGULATIONS. COAL—Coal mining rights may be leased for twenty years, renewable at an annual rental of \$1 an acre. Not more than 2,660 acres can be leased to one applicant. Royalty, five cents per ton. In unreserved territory the tract must be surveyed and the title of the person, and personal application to the Agent or Sub-Agent of Dominion Lands for the district in all cases be made and the rental for the first year must be paid to the agent within thirty days after filing application.
