MOTOR STOCKS ARE STRONGER

Studebaker Mysteriously
Flights and Leads List—
Mexican Pete Increases
Early Gains.

(McDougall & Cowans)
New York, Oct. 25.—The market
was featured in the afternoon by pro-
nounced strength in a few issues and
a tendency to sag off in the remainder
of the list. MND increased its early
gains. American Steel Foundries made
a new high and Smelters advanced
sharply, probably somewhat in sym-
pathy with the movement in Mexican
Pete, which is believed to be based
in part on prospects for better polit-
ical conditions in Mexico. In the late
trading the motor stocks became de-
cidedly strong under the lead of Stude-
baker.
There was no specific news to
account for any of these movements.
The newspapers had various highly
interesting accounts of a violent dis-
cord in Washington and of trou-
blesome scenes in the German Reich-
stag.

FIVE BOLSHEVIKI SENTENCED IN N. Y.

Three Got Twenty Years in
Penitentiary and Are Fined
\$1,000 Each.

New York, Oct. 25.—Five anarchists
were sentenced today. All five are
Russians, not naturalized, and self-
acknowledged supporters of the Bol-
sheviki. The three principal conspira-
tors, Samuel Lipman, Jacob Abrams,
and Hyman Lachowsky, in addition
to 20 year terms in the Maryland
State Penitentiary, were sentenced to
pay fines of \$1,000 each. Hyman
Lachowsky, who after his arrest added
the department of justice in rounding
up his associates, and who was shown
to have been led by the others, was
fined \$1,000 and sent to the same
prison for three years. Mollie Stumar,
a diminutive revolutionary, who openly
defied all authority, including that
of the court, was ordered to pay a fine
of \$500 and serve fifteen years in the
penitentiary at Jefferson
City, Mo.
The quietest had printed, and threw
from roof tops in the east side section
of New York, last August, circulars
urging the action of the govern-
ment in sending troops to Russia and
urging workers in munitions plants to
strike rather than "make bullets to
murder not only Germans, but the
brave workers in Russia."

BANKERS' ACTION CURTAILS STOCK OPERATIONS

In Early Selling Many Weak
Bull Accounts Were Uncover-
ed, Leaving Market in
Stronger Technical Position
Than Before—Still Dull and
Weak.

New York, Oct. 25.—The most ob-
vious effect of the step taken yester-
day by the local money committee
to reduce bank loans was a further
curtailment of operations on the
stock exchange today. Active selling
at the outset was attended by de-
clines of 1 to 4 points in the more
vulnerable issues, but much of this
loss was quickly recovered, while
here and there a few noteworthy
gains were established.
In the selling of the early period
many weak bull accounts were un-
covered, leaving the market in a
stronger technical position than be-
fore.
The action of the money pool was
received with satisfaction in all but
speculative circles. Interior banks
offered large sums of call money, the
rate holding at six per cent, but
prime bank acceptances were re-
duced to 4 1/4 per cent.

Mexican Pete Strong.

Next to United States Steel, which
moved in a narrow groove and closed
at a loss of practically one point, the
most active stock was Mexican Pe-
te. From its initial decline of al-
most four points rapid recovery was
made, ending at a gain of six points.
Other big American Smelters,
some of the more Sumatra Tobacco
and low grades of steel finished at
variable advances, but the general
list developed fresh heaviness later,
and equipment again yielding
to pressure. Total sales amounted to
600,000 shares.
Peace rumors caused renewed
weakness in exchange rates to the
neutral countries, particularly Swit-
zerland and Scandinavian centres.
Foreign issues reacted moderately
to the war loans and the general
domestic group on more contracted
dealings. Total sales, par value, as-
sessed \$2,275,000.
Old United States bonds were un-
changed on call.

SON OF JAY GOULD SUES FOR DIVORCE

Frank J. Gould Institutes Pro-
ceedings in French Courts—
Both Wives Named Kelley.

New York, Oct. 25.—News has reached
St. John from Paris that Frank
J. Gould, son of the late Jay Gould
and younger brother of George J.
Gould, has instituted proceedings for
divorce in the French courts against
his wife, Mrs. Edith Kelley Gould.
First intimation that Mr. Gould's
second marriage had ended unhappily
was given by a Paris newspaper,
a reporter for which obtained from
Charles O. Leach, attorney for Mr.
Gould in Paris, a confirmation of the
statement that proceedings had been
started by Mr. Gould. It is under-
stood that the ground for the action
is incompatibility of temper.
Mr. Gould is living in his country
home at Maisons-Laffitte, near Paris,
where are his racing stables. Mrs.
Gould has been living in Paris since
their separation.
