British and Foreign.

The prominent provisions in the Bill require the applicant for a license to be recommended by six of his neighbors; the fees for a license are more than double the existing charges; no retail license to a wholesale dealer; no retail license to sell on premises where other goods are sold; no side or back entrances to retail rum shops; and all retail grog shops closed at 9 p. m.
