I.W.W. AND OTHERS
NEW YORK, Jan. 6.—Department
f justice agents in New York, who have been watching German suspects in this city, have been assigned to the work of frustrating the activities of five groups of Bolsheviki, which have established headquarters here, it was announced to-night, The spread of Bolshevism was admitted to have become "alarming," Coinci-dentally Alfred Becker, deputy state attorney, stated that his department has unearthed evidence that secret agents of Lenine and Trotzky have reached this city with a fund of nearly \$500,000 to be used for pro-

paganda purposes.

These agents, it was said, have been circulating in workshops and factories, holding secret meetings, which culminated to-day in the open-ing session of a three-day convention in the Labor Lyceum building.


