

when he sought to enter the territory as the first Lieut.-Governor, Dec., 1869. Represented Winnipeg and St. John in the Manitoba Assem. from the first meeting of that body, 1871, until Jan. 1874, when he resigned, in order to confine himself to the Commons. First returned to the Commons for Selkirk on the admission of Manitoba into the Union, 1871; re-elected at g.e. 1872, 1874 and 1878. Upon petition, the election of 1878 was voided. At the new election that took place on 10 Sept., 1880, he was an unsuccessful candidate. Elected for present seat at g.e. 1887 and 1891. SOMERVILLE, JAMES. (*North Brant.*)

Family came from Fifeshire, Scot., in 1833, and settled in Dundas, Ont. B. in Dundas, 7 June, 1834. Ed. at Common and Grammar Schools. M. 1858, Janette, dau. of Mr. Alex. Rogers, of Co. Dumfries, Ont. Was editor and proprietor of the *Dundas True Banner* (Reform), up to 1886. He established the *True Banner* in 1858, previous to which he was editor and proprietor of the *Ayr Observer* (Reform), which he established in 1854 and disposed of in 1858, on his removing to Dundas. Has filled every municipal office, and has been Warden of the Co. of Wentworth, and Mayor of Dundas. First returned to the Commons at g.e. 1882 and re-elected at g.e. 1887 and 1891. A Liberal.—*Dundas, Ont.*

SPOHN, PHILIP HOWARD, M.D. (*East Simcoe.*)

S. of Philip and Elizabeth Bowman Spohn, both of U. E. Loyalist descent. Great grandfather, Capt. Philip Spohn and grandfather Capt. Peter Bowman, both served in the Loyal Contingent of the British forces against the Thirteen Sovereign States. At the close of Revolutionary War they settled in the Niagara (Ont.) peninsula and served in the war of 1812-13. B. in Ancaster in 1842 and ed. at the Grammar Sch. there and at Victoria Univ., graduating M. D. in 1869. M. 1878, Editha Sarah, dau. of the late A. A. Thompson of Penetanguishene. Was a mem. of the Municipal Council of Simcoe for ten years. First returned to Parlt. at last g.e. A Liberal.—*Penetanguishene.*

SPROULE, THOMAS SIMPSON, M.D. (*East Grey.*)

S. of James Sproule, a native of Tyrone, Irel., who
