A special notice to Tenants and Landlords

Tenants in apartment buildings should receive a cash payment from their landlords this month under the terms of the Government of Ontario's Residential Property Tax Reduction Program.

The payments are designed to ease the burden of municipal and education taxes on tenants and homeowners. In effect, the Province is paying part of the property taxes for each eligible house and apartment.

If you are a tenant, you should receive your tax rebate from your present landlord on or before December 31, 1970. Tenants who have occupied their present premises for less than a full year should receive a pro-rated rebate equal to one-twelfth of the total reduction for each month's tenancy.

Tenants who moved out of their premises earlier in the year should have also received a prorated payment within 30 days of moving. If you have not received this rebate, contact your previous landlord.

Tenants of flats or basement

apartments in houses may not qualify because the premises they rent are not separately assessed. For example, roomers are not eligible. If you are unsure of your status or eligibility, contact your municipal tax office.

Elderly people eligible for the Residential Property Tax Reduction payment as tenants of separately assessed dwellings may also have received benefits under the Government of Ontario's 1970 program of Tax Assistance for the Elderly. (Those entitled to the Federal Guaranteed Income Supplement).
