// ~~Interference~~ since my last inspection, I was surprised to find the Agent drawing rations for himself and family as I was not aware that the order to do so had been issued nor do I know that there are any supplies on hand for the purpose: I was also under the impression that an Agent should cease to draw living allowance when travelling to his reserves as soon as he commenced to draw rations but this does not appear to be the case: as it now stands this Agent draws full rations for himself and family, he visits one arrow reserve on Farm 10. he takes with him for subsistence upon the journey the provisions furnished him by the Department and at the same time charges two dollars a day, living allowance and seventy five cents a day for his teamster who also draws full rations; I also

observe that
