

Governor General in Council to enter into this Agreement and he, concurring, has by Order in Council dated December twenty-second 1936 (P.C. 3237) authorized the Honourable Norman McLeod Rogers, Minister of Labour of Canada, to execute the same on behalf of the Dominion.

NOW THEREFORE it is agreed by and between the parties hereto as follows:

1. Subject to the terms and conditions hereinafter contained, the Dominion will pay to the Province fifty per centum (50%) of all expenditures incurred by the Province, from January 1, 1937 to March 31, 1937, inclusive, (including in such expenditures all items specified by way of exception as proper items of cost in Schedule "A" hereto but excluding all other of the expenses, costs and damages enumerated in said Schedule) in inaugurating and carrying on on a day labour basis the project described in the next succeeding paragraph hereof and in placing and maintaining in employment upon said project single homeless individuals over the age of 16 years who are unemployed, without means of support and who otherwise would be in need of direct relief; provided that in no event shall the maximum Dominion contribution in respect of this Agreement exceed Fifteen Thousand five hundred dollars (\$15,500.00).

Whenever any question arises relative to the liability of the Dominion to contribute to any expenditure incurred, or certified as having been incurred, pursuant to the provisions of this Agreement, the decision of the Minister of Labour of Canada in respect thereto shall be final and binding.

2. The project to be comprised in this agreement shall consist of skirting out the timber and brush along the inter-provincial boundary line between the Provinces of New Brunswick and Quebec to a width of approximately one rod over a distance of approximately one hundred and four (104) miles, including low stumping, burning and other operations incidental thereto.

3. The Province agrees in placing individuals in employment as aforesaid, and under the Farm Improvement and Employment Plan that preference shall be given to single transients.
