PRODUCE MOVED BY RAILWAYS.

We present below our usually complete returns of the shipments of flour and grain from each station of the railways west and north. These returns are important, as indicating the sources from whence supplies of grain are drawn, and the points at which the heaviest purchases are made. The Paris station still bears away the palm as the most important local grain point on the three roads—the shipments last year being 150,384 barrels of flour and 464,519 oushels of wheat, exquivalent to nearly one and a quarter millions of bushels of grain. From Sarnia and Windsor the returns are heavy, but it will be remembered that they are entirely composed of through freight:—
