HOMPSTEAD DUTIDS.

Her who has been granted an entry for a homestead is requi provisions of the Deminice Lands Act and the amendmin to perform the conditions connected therewith, under one lowing plans:-to require

At least six months' raddence upon and cultivation of the land ch year during the term of three years.

(3) If the father (or motifier, if the father is deceased) of the home-steader reades upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for the requirements as to residence may be satisfied by such person re-siding with the father or mother.

(3) If a sottler was entitled to and has obtained entry for a second homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence prior to obtain-ing patent may be satisfied by residence upon the first homestead, if the second homestead is in the vicinity of the first homestead.

(4) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of the needlence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land. The term "vicinity" used above is meant to indicate the same town, township or an adjoining or cornering township. A settler who avails himself of the provisions of Clauses (2), (8) or (4) must culturate 80 acres of his homestead, or substitute 20 head of acres substantially fenced.

The privilege of a second entry is restricted by law to those settlers only who completed the duries upon their first homesteads to entitle them to patent on or before the 2nd June, 1858. Every homesteader who fulls to comply with the requirements of the homestead law is liable to are his entry cancelled, and the land may be again throws one for entry. APPLICATION FOR PATENT

should be made at the end of three years, before the Local Agent, Sub-Agent, or the Homestead Isspector. Before making application fer patent, the settler mapt give six months' sotice in writing to the Com-missioner of Dominion Lands, at Ottawa, of his intention to do so.

#### INFORMATION.

INFORMATION, Newly arrived immigration Office in Manitoba or the North-Winnipeg or at any Dominion Lands Office in Manitoba or the North-West Territories, information as to the lands that are open for entry, and from the officers in charge, free of expense, advice and associatance, in securing land to spit them. Full information respecting the land, timber, coal and mineral law, as well as respecting Dominion Lands in the Railway Beit in British Columbia, may be obtained upon applica-tion to the Secretary of the Department of the Interior, Ottawa, the Commissioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, Manitoba, or to any of the Dominion Land Agents in anitoba or the North-West Territories.
